It was the early 1990's, and nearly no services were available for the homeless in Elgin. People wandered the streets by day and hid in the shadows by night. One man, Mr. Dale Jaacks, refused to look the other way and went on a personal crusade to rally the church to respond.

From that effort, The Wayside Center opened on March 11, 1993 on Dundee Avenue, offering job training, free lunches and, above all, the Gospel of Jesus Christ. For the past 25 years The Wayside Center has made Christ known to thousands of men, women, and children.

Making Christ Known . . . Through Serving the Homeless Community

During the last twelve months, the Volunteers and Staff at the Wayside Center . . .

Opened the door to 8,371 guest visits and served 12,557 meals Poured 20,928 cups of coffee

Laundered 1,872 loads of clothing

Taught 832 Bible studies

Distributed 9,347 articles of clothing

Provided guests with a cumulative sum of 5,344 showers
