The Result of a Transformed Life

Jesse and Carlos know, firsthand, the result of a transformed life.

Carlos endured a life filled with alcohol addiction. He was in and out of recovery programs but, time after time, slipped back into his addictive behavioral pattern. Although he was resistant to come to Wayside Cross Ministries, after extensive prayer, he entered the Master's Touch program. Today, he realizes God's love for him, that there is no condemnation in Christ, and that God's mercies are new every morning. He committed himself to his work, hopeful to make a

difference. His commitment was recognized as he was recently hired as full-time staff cashier and team leader at Hope Chest, one of Wayside's resale shops.

Jesse was introduced to a life of drugs and alcohol at a very young age. He was in and out of





jail several times and, in time, became sick of it all: a friend directed him to Wayside Cross Ministries. After entering the Master's Touch program, Jesse embraced the gospel and Jesus Christ, and made a significant transformation. He was able to have much needed hip-replacement surgery and took the initiative to become healthier. He worked in warehouse operations for several years. Because of Jesse's transformation both spiritually and physically, and his commitment to doing a good job, he was recently

hired as full-time staff as sorting supervisor in Wayside's Hope Outreach division. Jesse learned so much about how to serve the Lord and do His will, and God has made his life better.

Carlos and Jesse are great examples of transformed lives through the power of His gospel and a relationship with Jesus Christ.
