BTL UPDATE Good News

WCM's Bridge to Life Capital Campaign has reached a very important goal. The \$7.9 million campaign began almost 5 years ago with the commitment to begin building when we reached the 75% mark.

With a commitment of funding through New Markets Tax Credits (and a grant from a private foundation) added to the generosity of so many WCM supporters, we are pleased to announce that we've surpassed the 75% mark!

It's time to get ready to break ground on the new four story 48,000 square foot facility that will replace the existing 100 year old building that now houses the Master's Touch Ministry at 215 East New York Street in Aurora. The new building will provide more appropriate living quarters, classrooms and counseling rooms, a learning center and updated physical plant which will greatly improve efficiency and reduce costs.

Look for an announcement for the ground breaking ceremony in the near future, and continue to pray for this much needed facility.

DONATED ITEMS CAN BE USED IN SEVERAL DIFFERENT WAYS THAT NOT ONLY IMPACT WCM BUT ALSO OUR COMMUNITY



For those people in our community who are in need due to a recent tragedy or other circumstances, we have a *Community Outreach* program that provides items to them at no cost.

Another area of distribution is our *Hope Chest Resale Store* which not only helps fund the ministries of WCM but also serves a need for affordable shopping in our surrounding area.

Often times we have needs that arise within our building and staff offices, such as the need for a new door or filing cabinets that can be easily filled by items donated rather than spending crucial funds out of our budget.

The last option for distribution is the sale of recycled materials.

We recycle scrap metal as well as clothing and shoes that are too soiled or worn which in turn brings in more funds for the Kingdom work being done here.

Please consider donating your gently used items so they can be put to good use.

Along with passionate volunteers the majority of our receiving, sorting and distribution process is handled by residents of our Master's Touch men's program. This work rehabilitation component to our residential program is one of the things that makes Master's Touch unique.

We have come to see that due to several reasons including homelessness and drug/ alcohol addiction, many of our residents have not held steady employment in the years prior to coming to Wayside.

These men are given an opportunity to work six days a week in our warehouse, resale store and on the donation trucks that facilitate our pickups. This gives them the chance to orient themselves to a normal schedule, feel a sense of pride in the work they accomplished and build their resume. Another opportunity exists when we bring former residents on as staff members at WCM. The most recent addition to our staff is Michael, Sorting Supervisor who was welcomed in March and currently assists in our warehouse sorting department.



New Washer for Wayside Cross Ministries

Washing clothes here is a big task. Every week the clothes and linens for up to 95 men have to be washed in our laundry. We traditionally maintain a laundry of donated used washers and dryers and maintenance can be an issue.

Thanks to the efforts of our donors Brad and Gail Van Horn and the generosity of Dexter Laundry in Fairfield Iowa, Wayside now has a commercial washing machine that makes our task easier. It washes faster and cleaner and saves water. Thanks to the Van Horns and Dexter Laundry.

Parking Lot Sale

On April 27th the Hope Outreach division held the first of three Parking Lot Sales scheduled for this year. Accompanying the sale for the first time was a representative from Moody Radio who we are so thankful to have as one of our partners. Moody, amongst other local radio stations, is an integral part of getting the word out about our spring and summer sales. These yearly sales are an opportunity for us to make more room for incoming donations and provide even better deals than are normally found in the Hope Chest Resale Store. We sold anything from old cameras to children's bicycles with all of the proceeds going to help fund the ministry at WCM. After the tents came down and everything was loaded up we were blessed to have had one of the best sales yet. We would like to thank everyone who came out and supported us. Annual Campaign Update



The Wayside Cross Annual Campaign continues to grow. Collections thus far this fiscal year exceed \$480,000 and are up 5% compared to last year, with more donors making generous donations. The campaign provides over 25% of the funds needed to continue the transformation in men's and women's lives that takes place every day.

Birnie Harper, Annual Campaign Coordinator, stated "We are blessed to

have a generous, loyal and growing group of supporters. Their generosity matters to us, because we cannot exist without them. We also have a wonderful group of volunteers. Many of them have worked on the Annual Campaign for 20, 30, 40 or even 50 vears."

WCM has had an Annual Campaign every year of its existence. The 85th campaign will kick off in August. We will need your support.
