

God Led Me Back to Lifespring

Alice's life was tumbling out of control. Her heroin use had been a regular part of her life for over 20 years.

Alice was born to German parents, placed for adoption and, soon after, adopted by American parents, but it wasn't a happy childhood. Her mother and father were both alcoholics, and her mother was physically and mentally abusive. Alice ran away from home at age 15 and never returned.

Alice had been searching for something to fill a void in her life that had haunted her for many years. She tried finding it in relationships with men she thought loved her, but only found deceit. In the late 70s, she experimented with drugs, and that became the fix she needed to fill the void.

Her habit was so significant, she began stealing to support it. In spite of her many trips to prison, Alice returned to the lifestyle she was so familiar with: she feared change.

Alice's first visit to Lifespring was upon her parole out of prison in December of 2015. She left after spending a month there and went back to what she knew best: getting high. This lasted for two years but, once again, the law caught up to her. After eight months in jail she spent 90 days in an intense treatment program and it



was in that program that Lifespring came up again; Alice couldn't get Lifespring out of her mind.

It was there that Alice returned in September of 2017. She is the first to say that God led her back to Lifespring. God has done many miracles in her life, but the one that stands out the most to her is that she is still alive. She has been sober for two years and credits her sobriety to the relationship she now has with

Jesus Christ, thanks to the Christ-centered, Bible-based teachings Lifespring offers, a wonderful mentor, the staff, and many volunteers who taught her boundaries and how to live a life free of the chains that previously held her captive, all thanks to the redeeming power of Jesus Christ.

The one thing Alice now holds in her heart is the one thing her father wanted for her, and that was to be a good Christian. It is her desire to give back, in particular, to help those who are runaways, especially young girls, and to share the love of Christ and the life she now lives.

Alice is graduating from Lifespring soon. She is building a relationship with her son, she works fulltime outside of Lifespring and works all day on Saturdays at Lifespring as a resident assistant. She is finally at peace, in her words: "happy for the first time in my life."
