

FAITH MOVES MOUNTAINS

In Matthew 17:20, Jesus says: "Truly I tell you, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you."

Greg's life was in turmoil. He started using drugs in high school, and his addiction heightened throughout his life. He was in and out of rehab centers frequently, but nothing seemed to help. Although he knew God was all around him, Greg kept his distance, only praying when things got tough. Despite this, he knew God was trying to get his attention. Greg's brother brought him to Wayside Cross Ministries (WCM), and at first, Greg didn't think it was the place for him, but he soon learned otherwise.

Through the programs at WCM, Greg learned one of the most significant lessons he felt he needed to learn: humility. As Greg humbled himself to help others, doors began to open. After 16 months, Greg left the walls of WCM and went out to earn his living and help others.

At first, his business was slow to start up but, in time, he became busy enough to hire an employee. God brought him together with Ed, and they've worked together every day for the last two years.



Ed came to WCM after serving his sentence at Big Muddy prison and in preparation for leaving there, he sent out over 100 applications to various 'transition' facilities. He prayed over these when sending them out, asking God to be very clear about where he should go. Ed wanted only one option and wanted it to be God's decision because when he made a choice, it was always the wrong choice. Well, out of those 100 letters, he received only one letter back, and it was from Wayside Cross Ministries. Ed entered the program at WCM in July of 2010.

Ed worked in the warehouse for six weeks and then was transferred to work at the front desk. Ed was not comfortable working at the front desk because he wasn't comfortable being the center of attention, but sometimes God pushes us out of our comfort zones, and that's what he did with Ed. Because he was able to interact with others, opportunities came along for Ed.

Ed found his home church at the Oasis Church in Aurora, where he now serves as a deacon. In 2011, through the church, Ed met the owner of a flooring company, who offered him a job working in the warehouse. Ed moved into WCM's Horizon House, in Batavia and was given a vehicle by another church, and continued to receive blessing after blessing.

Through his stay at WCM, Ed now realizes the importance of structure, going to chapel every day, reading the Bible, getting up and having meals at the same time, being responsible but, most of all, following the rules.

He knows God comes first and he knows the importance of praying and having faith.

Greg and Ed faced many mountains, different mountains, and yet, through each one's faith, were able to move those mountains as they trusted God and His faithfulness.

God brought a brotherhood and friendship together and provided Greg and Ed with the opportunity to help others, by learning a multitude of skills as handymen. Both men never imagined what would happen as they allowed faith as small as a mustard seed to work and grow in their lives. They feel blessed by what God has done, and continues to do every day.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Wayside was recently introduced to a North Aurora company by one of our board members. That company is RECORA; they manufacture custom electrical Switchmats and flexible pressure sensitive switches. Recently the owner and their three managers came to tour our

main campus on East New York Street. They learned about our programs and met some of the residents. They were impressed by what we do and the fact that our residents get second and sometimes third chances here.

They were interested in offering some of our men from the program an opportunity for employment, and Terrell became the first beneficiary.

Last June we featured Terrell in our Impact newsletter. He was working towards his GED,



attending school and getting top grades. All that hard work paid off because in December he became an employee at RECORA. Terrell is delighted with the job and gives all the glory to Jesus Christ.

Terrell wants to give back, especially to the youth. He

doesn't want the kids who looked up to him in the past life to continue down the same path as he did. "I don't live on that path anymore; I live the way of the Lord. That's where I want these kids to live, too", said Terrell.

He is still part of the WCM program, and is in Phase IV, which allows him to work and continue to live here. He is grateful for his time at Wayside Cross Ministries, and for those who helped him through his journey, a journey that is just beginning.
