"Covid-19 has brought with it many challenges this summer, especially for children. It has shut down camps. It has cancelled field trips. It has even closed the pools. It is difficult to find any good; yet God is good. I am reminded of His goodness when I think of one particular student who came to camp for the first time this summer. We first met him when we went to his house to drop off a lunch and activity kit to his younger sister, and he answered the door. He had never attended one of our camps before-we didn't even know his sister had an older brother! We asked him how old he was and if he would be interested in coming to our "camp", or back-vard bible club. We left an extra permission slip with him and went on our way. I was thrilled to see him come on the first day! In the second week we offered anyone who didn't have a Bible at home to take one at the end of the day.

As soon as I finished teaching, he quickly went over to where the Bibles were stored and picked one out to take home with him. Covid-19 has taken away many things from us. Near the end of camp, she was way more talkative, would smile regularly, and would eagerly participate during Bible time.

The Aurora Neighborhood Baseball League was set to begin indoor try-outs the day after schools shut down back in



March. By the time things opened up enough for other little-leagues in the area to begin bringing their teams together, it became obvious that the necessary guidelines to keep our kids safe would be too expensive. Over the years, the ANBL has survived on generous donations of uniforms and gloves, but bats and helmets have always been shared. There was simply no way to provide each child with their own set of equipment. The decision to cancel our baseball program is just another example of how some communities are effected by the pandemic more than others. On the bright side, scholarships allowed 4 of our boys to take part in the Boys Baseball of Aurora program!
