You Gave Traci a **Place to Be Safe** and Start Over

rowing up in a household she describes as • "volatile," it's not surprising Traci entered into a relationship marked by domestic violence herself. She raised two daughters, staying with them in a shelter for a time to escape the abuse at home.

Traci managed to get through tough years until her daughters were grown. Then she hit rock bottom. Suffering from a gambling addiction, she was unable to pay her rent — and fell into another destructive relationship. "I packed a couple things in a small bag, took a flight to Illinois, and left some very difficult things behind me," she says.

However, there was still more difficulty ahead. Traci was staying in a hotel, living off her savings. She found work, but when her savings ran out, her paychecks didn't go far enough to cover her expenses. Then, her ex found out where she was staying.

Traci went to a domestic violence shelter, where she learned about Wayside's Lifespring Ministry for women. "This was a place where I could get my addiction under control, figure out what kept fueling my negative relationships, find a job, and get back on my feet. The program has been tremendously helpful," she says.

Traci tells us Lifespring taught her the importance of community. "It's okay sometimes to not be strong and to lean on your sisters in Christ. Lifespring gives us an environment where we can do that safely," she says.

Today, Traci is a Lifespring graduate, lives in a Lifespring apartment, and has joined the Lifespring staff as a part-time resident coordinator. She also works at a day care facility as a teacher's aide. She has found a nearby church home where she is a member of the choir and teaches Vacation Bible School.

"I'm thankful to Lifespring for giving me a place to be safe and to rebuild healthy ways of living," Traci says. "I hope people will continue to support Wayside Cross Ministries and Lifespring because they invest in the women in the program, building us up into good community citizens."

Do you love baseball — and kids?

The Aurora Neighborhood Baseball League needs coaches for our teams and umpires for this season's games.

ur league runs from May through July, with practices and games included within that time frame. Our program serves children in three co-ed leagues, which include boys and girls exclusively from East Aurora. Our first league is T-ball for kids 5 to 6 years old; our next is the Minor League, serving ages 7 to 9; and our Major League is for ages 10 to 12.

Each child in the Major and Minor Leagues receives an MLB jersey, pants, socks, and a hat. Children in our T-ball League receive a jersey and a hat. All players get to keep their uniforms at the end of the season. The league and donors provide the equipment the players use such as bats, gloves, helmets, catcher's gear, etc.

Registration for the ANBL is open to East Aurora boys and girls ages 5 to 12.
