







MINISTRY IMPACT

Master's Touch Ministry

- 43 men graduated the Master's Touch program.
- 4 men were hired onto WCM staff.
- 14 men were promoted to Resident Assistant.
- 38 men found full-time jobs.



Lifespring Ministry

- 25 women joined the program.
- 5 women graduated the one-year program.
- 16 children joined the program alongside their mothers.
- 7 women made a profession of faith.
- 20 women who were believers before joining grew in their faith during the program.
- 19 residents made a significant improvement in their life skills.
- 13 residents entered the work force.

Hope Outreach Ministry

- · Provides the men in the program daily, real-life work experience, enhancing or learning new skills in our warehouse, transportation department, maintenance shop, housekeeping department, Hope Chest Resale Store, Sweet Charity Resale Store, and Hope On Wheels.
- · Maintained 11 ministry vehicles, traveling an average of 6,000 miles per
- · Scheduled, transported, sorted, and refurbished over 500,000 donated items including clothing, furniture, household goods, and other miscellaneous objects. These items were sold at the Hope Chest & Sweet Charity Resale stores. They were also distributed to under-resourced men, women, and children in the community or within one of Wayside Cross' ministries.

- 1,081 bales at over 800 lbs. each of clothing and 1,698 bags of shoes, for a total of 914,571 lbs. were recycled with the majority of those items going to third-world/developing countries.
- Operated 17 donation bins at partner churches, collecting 22,142 bags of donated clothing weighing 487,124 lbs.
- Proceeds from our resale stores, Hope on Wheels, income from recycled clothing, and scrap metal totaled \$941,486, all of which went to fund ministry efforts at WCM.

New Life Corrections Ministry

- Went to Stateville NRC Prison 50 times, with over 5,000 inmates visited, 250 volunteers.
- Handed out 2,400 Bibles in jails and prisons.
- Had over 80 volunteers come to our two prison training sessions.
- Passed out over 13,000 Dads & Freedom From Fear brochures to inmates.
- Passed out 4,000 books and pamphlets to inmates.
- Baptized over 40 innmates.

Urban Youth Ministry

- 19 UYM middle- and high-School youth attended a 4-night Bible Camp in Indiana.
- **399** collective volunteer hours were given by UYM summer camp youth.
- 7 teams competed in UYM's Summer Olympics, fostering teamwork, leadership, and friendship across all ages.

- 100+ Bible verses were memorized during UYM's Bible time, helping kids learn God's Word in a fun and meaningful way.
- Over 20 Wigglebots, Pandabots, and racecars were crafted during APS Academy, teaching perseverance and creative problem-solving.
- Dozens of essays, 5 volunteer sessions, 7 Bible lessons, and memorized Bible verses earned middle- and high-school students a coveted spot at this year's Family Youth and Bible Camp.
- 500+ brand new Christmas gifts were donated for the UYM Christmas Merit Store
- 109 games were played by Aurora Neighborhood Baseball League.
- 11 Aurora Police Department Community Officers played Dodgeball with our UYM youth.
- 45 churches and organizations collaborated with UYM.
- 104 days of free transportation for UYM youth.
- 7 Field trips.



2024 Revenue Sources




Volunteers Needed

Over the years, more than 100 people have made a bequest to Wayside Cross Ministries. 

God's Masterful Use of Evil for Good


For the past thirty years, Elgin Wayside Center has been a source of hope and comfort to many unhoused and underprivileged individuals forced to live and sleep on the streets, in cars, tents, and abandoned buildings. This past year, 2024, the Center has garnered much attention as the city of Elgin grappled with the ever-increasing homeless population and struggled to find a "solution" to the plight of men and women.

In a classic example of God using "evil for good," (Genesis 50:20), when December saw the eruption of two separate fires in "Tent City." Thankfully, no residents or firefighters were harmed, but the incidents drew attention to the problem of homelessness and the lack of available housing. As the city tried to address this challenge, I was asked to participate in a panel discussion aired on a local radio station. The panel featured a number of social agencies and advocates working to address this crisis. While all these organizations seek to provide shelter and other needed resources to the homeless and underprivileged, only Elgin Wayside Center – and our "parent" organization Wayside Cross Ministries – proclaimed hope in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. This is our true "calling" – to serve the homeless and underprivileged that they might experience transformed lives through the gospel!

"Reggie" is one of our clients who is continually growing in this transformed, abundant life. Reggie has graced us with his presence for some time and is a "regular" visitor. He is active in a local church and has a strong desire to "eat up" the Word. Recently, he discovered how many of the promises and events of the Old Testament point to Christ and surface in the pages and message of the New Testament. This past year Reggie obtained his driver's license and continues to apply for jobs in the Elgin area. We are excited to welcome him into our new overnight program in 2025, where he will be better equipped to establish himself as a contributing member to his church and community and move from dependency on homeless shelters and programs to the abundant life in Christ (John 10:10; Ephesians 3:20).

The work of the Lord has been clear this past year as we move toward occupying a new facility, instituting a new overnight program, and seeing more of our clients experience "new life." We are grateful for God's grace and blessing upon this ministry. We are also ever mindful of our faithful supporters. These supporters freely give of their "time, talent, and treasure" and in doing so, help this ministry to "provide the poor wanderer with shelter" (Isaiah 58:7). We are trusting the Lord to continue to shower this ministry with blessings in 2025.





NEW LIFE CORRECTIONS



Nitti grew up on an American Indian reservation with his parents and twin brother. Tragically,

at just five years old, his brother was murdered beside him. The trauma of that loss stayed with Nitti throughout his life. At 18, he volunteered for military service and spent six years in the Air Force, where he learned to fly. It was during his time in the military that his struggle with alcohol began.

After leaving the Air Force, Nitti worked in the oil fields, developed a passion for sailing, and discovered a love for painting. He did marry, but his battle with alcohol continued. Eventually, he separated from his wife and later moved to Chicago, where he had a daughter, Makala, who became the love of his life. Nitti supported Makala through school, and she proudly graduated from college.

His drinking eventually led to trouble. Nitti spent 14 years in prison, a period that became the turning point in his life. While incarcerated at Big Muddy Prison, he encountered the transformative power of faith. His Chaplain quided him to understand that Jesus had a purpose for his life, and Nitti embraced this newfound faith. He immersed himself in Bible study and AA meetings, determined to change.

Transferred to Danville Prison, Nitti expanded his ministry, using his art to reach others. It was at Danville that I first met Nitti during a DADS seminar. He was already a committed believer, helping other inmates grow in their faith. He shared his vision with me, and together we explored ways he could seek help once he was released.

Nitti arrived at Wayside in August 2023. From the start, he was a dedicated and serious resident, always encouraging others to stay and discover Jesus. His natural gift for shepherding was evident as he guided those around him to grow spiritually. After his graduation, he took on increasing responsibility, launching an art ministry called Litho Phyte. Through his art, Nitti began to make a significant impact. The city of Aurora commissioned him to paint a massive mural just a few blocks from Wayside, and he opened an art gallery and training studio nearby. His gallery showcases the work of inmates, a vision that has created a


bridge between the prison system and the community, helping incarcerated individuals find a


To me, Nitti is like a kindred brother. His love for Jesus is truly contagious, and it's an honor to witness the impact he's making in the lives of those around him.
